BACKGROUND

- This resolution is reforming what was previously known as the second year at large program that was largely undefined.

PURPOSE

- This legislation seeks to officially established the External Affairs Committee as an official committee and to be included in the general membership of Senate.

SUMMARY

- This resolution seeks to establish the External Affairs Committee.
- The External Affairs Committee will exist to aid the Senate Executive Director and the Senate representatives.
- The at larges that serve on this committee will be each assigned to a council (pending council approval) and an Agency of Senate.

WHEREAS SUMMARY

Lines 8 through 9 College Councils are essential to helping senate achieve its mission to serve and represent students, and councils are the most effective way to make sure diverse student voice is heard

Lines 11 through 13 Clear communication between Senate and the College Councils is essential to representing student voice.

ENACTED SUMMARY

Lines 14 through 33 Changing bullet point E in Article II to reflect the current internal committees within Senate.

lines 35 through 44 Changing bullet point F to reflect the structure of the Senate At Large class

Lines 48 through 81 Adding bullet point G to outline the structure of the External Affairs Committee

Lines 83 through 87 Adding bullet point G to reflect the current practice that was previously outlines in bullet point F of Article II.
